DEFINITION

- There is no single definition of youth.
- United Nations defines anyone between the ages of 15-24 as a youth.
- In some countries, individuals until the age of 35 years are considered youth.

The youth population is expected to grow by **7**% to 1.3 billion by 2030.

39 million children under 5 were overweight or obese in 2020




Zero vegetable or fruit consumption (6-23 months age) – **44**% (2018)
